
I just completed the mid-semester evaluations with my social work interns. One of them shared his journey with me last night. He is working full time in the IT industry with a local business as well as going to school full time and completing his 15 hr/week internship. He is also getting married this month. He's 25 years old. He met a wonderful girl when they were in the end of their High School years. She was in foster care and he had no idea that all kids did not have two parents, one home, and a healthy extended family of relatives like he did. His girlfriend (now fiancée) and her brothers had been in eight foster homes from the time they were very young. A short time after they met, the kids got moved out of town and she thought she would never see him again. Well he really liked her and decided he would drive two hours one-way every weekend to see her. It wasn't too long until the relatives they were living with decided that it was time for them to go...again! This is when my outstanding intern decided he was going to see how he could become a foster parent, especially for his girlfriend's little brother. By then, his fiancée was 18 and no longer officially in foster care. Her father had been killed as a result of his drug business and their mother had gotten involved in the same business and got deported. There were MANY meetings with the Department of Social Services. They were NOT interested in making these type of arrangements for these three kids with a young man. They were persistent and did everything he had to do to become licensed by the Department. Eventually, our intern officially adopted his fiancées little brother who is now 10 years old. There is an older sister who is also living with them until she is able to be on her own. Can you believe this story? He also wants to pursue his Master's Degree and change his career path. What a journey. There are many additional parts to their story but not enough space to tell it all to you. This is an amazing volunteer intern who is practicing what he is

As you can see from our annual statistics we have now worked with over 1600 children and youth in all of our programs during the 25.5 years we have been in operation. Our Adoptions have now topped 140. These children are with their "forever families". We continue to need many more foster and adoptive families to care for the vulnerable children and youth who are in desperate need of a healthy and safe home and family to live with. Our goals for 2013 are to recruit and train another 15-20 families to care for at least another 30 children and youth. We have a huge need for families that want to work with teenagers. We provide excellent training, supportive services, case management, and tax-free financial reimbursement. We do free, no obligation orientations at our office on the third Tuesday of every month; one during the day and one after work.
