At the Ranch there were 38 new youth residents, 17 boys graduated and 4 were reunified with their families. There was one high school graduation. Mental health was able to increase services to our youth.

FFA & ADOPTION



In FFA and Adoption, of the 25 children and youth admitted, there were 8 adoptions, 3 reunified with either their parent or a relative. There were 5 new families certified as resource parents.

TRANSITIONAL LIVING HOME



At the Transitional Living Home, out of the 5 that received housing, life skills and services, 1 left to permanent housing and 1 was admitted to the house as a new resident.

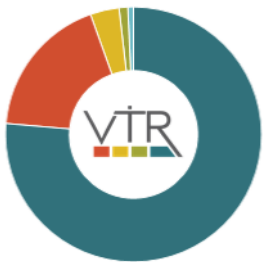

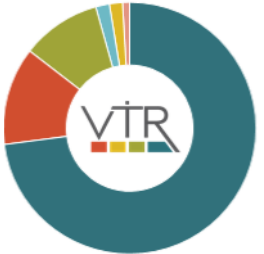
