Equine Assisted Psychotherapy

The picture on the top right shows our two horses in the early morning. They are used in Equine Assisted Psychotherapy (EAP) at the Ranch. Rather than ride the horses, youth will interact as staff provide a unique space for an emotionally safe, hands-on experience with the boys.




With real-time feedback, youth can learn about themselves and others to process and discuss feelings, behaviors, and patterns they see in their lives. There is a healing bond between humans and horses.
