VTR makes every effort to find placements through our Foster Family Agency, permanent homes for those kids in need of adoption, our teens at the Ranch who are in need of both mental and physical care, and transitional-age youth who are homeless and in need of a mentor to help them toward their next stage of life.

Our goal always is to provide the best in services for all the vulnerable kids we can. With two new additional programs, one at the Ranch, and one for our Transitional Living Home, we can reach out now to more youth that is marginalized, and need help through education, resources, and more. We also have the ability to help more of our youth off the streets and provide them with comfort and care.

Please take a look through our Impact Report to see that this has been a remarkable year for VTR. We moved past the pandemic and have begun to emerge stronger. Through planning, and strategizing future growth, last year we began to see that our hope for our kiddos and the future of VTR, is beginning to happen.

This year we applied for a Homekey Grant that will provide housing to 95 homeless youth, and single families, as well as transitioning foster vouth ages 18-24. We ask for your prayers that VTR could help even more kids and families find safety and shelter.
