## When The Boys Feel Love

One of the boys at the Ranch, spontaneously blurted out how he was feeling love for the staff at the Ranch. This isn't something you will hear. These boys come from trauma and their belief deep down is that no one can be trusted, that any intimacy is dangerous, and that to love or be loved, to have an attachment to someone, are things they hope for, but don't think will happen. Most of all, they often feel like they are flawed and not worthy of love.

Many act big and tough, so being vulnerable and showing love and emotion is thought of as weakness. When trauma victims are young, the relationships they had became sources of overwhelming fear, or they felt helpless and alone. The mind needs a way to cope so they often think things like, "don't trust, it's not safe!", "Don't ask for help, don't burden anyone", don't think about how you feel, just keep going". This helps them when they hurt everyday and need to survive.

The Ranch staff work hard at working with these boys to help them make sense of their inner world and how to relate to others. So this spontaneous and expressed feelings of love was a huge healing. A miracle.



We Welcome our New Clinical Director at the Ranch!

For the last six months VTR staff has been excited to welcome our new Clinical Director at the Ranch Vanessa A. Rakis-Garabedian, LMFT.

Vanessa came to us because she believed in our mission and the work we do to help our kids. Her heartfelt belief is that the boys are loved where they are into better circumstances-love into action.

Vanessa said, "We meet the boys where they are, support their growth and provide unconditional compassion. We have to connect all the pieces of what they need to make it work for their healing and a better future."

One of the residents who was 16 years old, gave the staff grief while at the Ranch. He would throw things and his behavior was challenging. The staff loved him where he was at, helped him in any way they could, and also taught him what they could while he was with them. It didn't end well as this young man ended up having to go to Juvenile Hall.

However, while there, the probation officer said he made significant improvements. "He is a whole different kid now." When he talked to the 16 year old about his changes, the boy said, "all I received was love and support while I was at VTR. I learned a lot".

Vanessa has made many new changes at a system level. Her focus on our leadership, improving communication, and the genuine appreciation she has for staff, has helped the Ranch in so many ways.

We are so happy to have Vanessa on staff, and look forward to the continued growth we have had in both employees and youth.
